Lets start inside...

	Kitchen	Staircases & Hallways
	Open and close all cabinet doors and drawers. Make adjustments to, or replace, all hardware that doesn't function properly.	Ensure all handrails are securely fastened
	Seal cracks in grout/sealant.	Garage
	Clear debris from disposal and sink drain. Look under the sink for leaks. Touch the pipes and fittings to ensure they're dry. Run the dishwasher and confirm the surrounding floor remains dry.	Lubricate overhead door springs and hinges with appropriate lubricant. Ensure automatic-reversal "eyes" are functional, if present. Adjust their aim as needed.
	Bedroom(s)	General Interior
	If a ceiling fan is present, ensure it is securely fastened and doesn't wiggle.	Check all lightbulbs.
	Ensure all light fixtures have globes or covers over the bulbs. Bathroom(s)	Locate all smoke detectors. Ensure there is a smoke detector in every bedroom, one in the hallway(s) leading to bedrooms, and at least one on each level. of the home. Press the "TEST" button on all alarms. Replace disfunctional alarms.
	Open and close <u>all</u> cabinet doors and drawers. Make adjustments to, or replace, all hardware that doesn't function properly.	Confirm each smoke detector is less than 10 years old. They have a 10 year service life. Locate all carbon monoxide alarms. Ensure there is a carbon monoxide alarm on each
	Seal cracks in grout/sealant, including in the tub and shower.	floor, and in each bedroom OR within 15 feet of each bedroom door.
	Ensure the toilet and toilet seat are securely fastened. Tighten as needed.	Confirm all CO alarms are less than 7 years old. They have a service life of 5-7 years.
	Clear all blockages in slow-draining sinks, showers and tubs.	Remove all extension cords. Power strips are OK.
		Check the furnace filter. Ensure it is clean and has been replaced within the last 3 months.
	Laundry Room Check the washing machine supply and	Clean all ash from the fireplace. Operate the damper to ensure it opens and closes.
	ain lines for leaks.	Confirm all light switches work as intended.
	Check under the sink, if present, for leaks.	
	Clean the dryer lint screen.	

Now, lets head outside!

Walkways and Patios	General Exterior
Wash/pressure wash with appropriate cleaners to eliminate moss, mold and mildew which lead to slip hazards.	Check all lightbulbs. Check all window screens for holes.
Replace all rotten deck boards.	Check for cracked sealant around doors and windows.
Roof	Trim trees and shrubs 2 feet away from the siding, and 6 feet away from the roof.
Look for moss and other debris on roof and in gutters. Call a professional to remove all debris.	Locate the dryer vent. Ensure the vent louvers are clear and that the vent is free of lint and other debris.
	Where feasible, ensure there is 6 inches of clearance between the ground and siding materials.
Siding and Soffit	
Look for loose/peeling paint and repair.	
Ensure there is no bare wood exposed on the outside of your home. All exterior building materials should be painted or sealed.
